During the pandemic, there has been a lot of discussion about people travelling outside Canada. While health officials and political leaders have strongly discouraged people from leaving the country and brought in requirements for returning travelers to quarantine, international travel has not been prohibited. Critics of this policy say it is allowing some Canadians to engage in risky behaviour by going overseas during the COVID-19 pandemic. Others say Canadians have a right to travel abroad if they want to or decide it's necessary.
