B5. The new budget adds about \$101 billion dollars in federal spending over the next three years, in addition to spending already announced for the year. The deficit - the amount the government spends versus what it earns back in revenue – is projected to be \$154 billion for the year. The debt, which is the total of all the deficits past and present, is expected to exceed \$1.3 trillion in the coming years.

Some people say Canadians are living through a once-in-100-years health crisis that has affected all parts of this country's society, and this level of spending is needed to get Canada back on track.
