Globally, much of the vaccination efforts have been concentrated in wealthier countries like Canada. While some countries – Canada included – have begun administering booster shots (third doses) to at-risk individuals, and are vaccinating children under the age of 12, less than five per cent of adults in low-income countries have been vaccinated.

Some people say that instead of offering boosters and vaccinating children, wealthier countries should be sending their supply to places where few people have received a first dose. Others say that it's important to end the pandemic at home and protect at-risk populations before focusing efforts abroad.

If it were up to you, would you say Canada should:
